In spite of Snowtober's Halloween Blackouts, YCCC rolled over all US Competition to win the US Unlimited Club Category with a whopping 21% margin! Our score was also higher than European Powerhaus Bavarian Contest Club! Here's what Bob Cox had to say in the Results writeup in September, 2012 CQ:

*"For 2011, the world's top club score was the Yankee Clipper Contest Club with nearly a half billion points".*

# Yankee Clipper Contest Club Meeting Minutes

## Boxboro, MA August 25, 2012

Vice President Dennis W1UE called the meeting of the YCCC to order at 1:15 pm.

Dennis then asked for a roll call of the members, prospective members and guests which was followed by the Treasurers report by Chet N8RA, a motion was made by K1XM and Seconded by Jerry K0TV to accept the report which carried.

Next Brian NJ1F gave the Secretary's report and a motion was made by K1XM to accept the report and was seconded by KB1W the motion carried.

Next Dennis W1UE asked if there was any old Business There was none.

W1UE then went on to New Business which was adding the YCCC Hall of Fame award to the clubs By-Laws. A motion was made to add the new bylaw as published in the Butt and discussed previously by K1XM and was seconded by K0TV. Dennis then asked if there was a super quorum of members where present. Brian NJ1F confirmed that there was. Dennis proceeded with a vote of those present. The creation of the YCCC Hall of Fame passed unanimously.

Dennis then gave an update on the various YCCC club projects. The SO2R box is still very popular and they are planning another run. The K1XM MOS Antenna Switch is wrapping up development and looking for a software writer to finish it up. The W1FV Circle Array receive antenna project is on hold. The YCCC band pass filter project there has been several asking for another run of this project which may happen in the future.

Next Dennis announced that this year's YCCC Scholarship recipient was the clubs own W1MAT who will be attending Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and a thank you letter that Matt had sent the club was displayed.

Dennis then announced that in the ARRL 2012 DX contest he had been notified that the YCCC had club score of 245 Million and the FRC had 215 Million. The YCCC wins again! Thank you to the members who got on the air and submitted a score.

Dennis then introduced Alec W2JU who gave a report on the scores and some interesting facts and statistics. Alec pointed out that the YCCC average reduction to a members score is 3.21 percent and the FRC's is 4.05 percent. Alec also pointed out that in CQWW the YCCC had 7 members whose logs were "GOLDEN" having no errors. George W1ZT had the highest Golden Log score of 2.6 million points in CQWW CW. 2011. Congrats!

Dennis then announced a 15 minute break.

The meeting was again called to order by Dennis who introduced Doug K1DG who gave a presentation on the WRTC 2014. The presentation included a history of the event, how it has evolved and what WRTC 2014 is looking to accomplish here in New England.

Some highlights from the presentation:

There will be 59 two operator teams from around the world.

8 of the teams are made up as follows, the winners from the last WRTC, A youth team, two wildcard teams, four sponsored teams at \$50,000 a team.

Doug then told the group that many YCCC members helped out with a test run of 13 WRTC stations during this year's IARU contest. Next year they hope to have 25 or more stations setup and active. Dennis then introduced the 9 new and returning members and a vote was taken to welcome them aboard.

Dennis then gave a presentation on his homebrew triplexer project and the results he was able achieve.

Dennis then conducted the door prize raffle for the ARRL Handbook, Bottle of Wine and ARRL Antenna Book.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by K1XM and Seconded by WA1ZAM the motion carried at 3:50pm.

# A Galvanizing Experience

It all started when a new ham friend of mine acquired a Rohn Fold-Over tower and about 70 ft of additional that had been standing for over 30 years. The surface of the tower sections varied from essentially no rust, to a couple of sections with almost a complete coating of light surface rust, with little of the original galvanizing remaining. After looking more closely we could detect no damage, but without treatment the sections would certainly not get better over the years. The possible choices, Paint, so-called “cold galvanize” (actually Zinc rich paint) or hot-dip galvanized (just like Rohn). Since the Zinc-Rich paint (ZRC and similar) would require extensive cleaning and result in only a 1.5mil protective coat, whereas the hot-dip galvanizing would include surface preparation and result in a 3mil (minimum) metallurgical bonded coating which according to the American Galvanizer’s Association <http://www.galvanizeit.org/> the could extend the life without additional maintenance (beyond inspections) for another 30 years or more vs use of paint which could require “touchup” in as little as 7 or 8 years, we decided to pool all of our sections and look for additional sections in order to meet a minimum “order size”.

So, we found a local galvanizer who had a tank large enough and put out a message on the YCCC reflector for others wishing to join us. Ultimately we collected a mixture of 35 Rohn 25 & 45 sections, 2 Cr-MO Masts plus a dozen or so miscellaneous pieces for a total of almost 2200lbs which easily meet the minimum lot size.

# Jack's Jack!

Ahoy maties! (Been a while since I said that!)

Thought this might be of use to someone since one member of our WRTC beam team hadn't seen it before, and there may be others. Having been tipped off in advance that it might be tough to separate the brand new Rohn 25 tower sections, I brought my tower jack that I've used for years...well not the one in the photo but I made a new one in ten minutes.



I drilled four mounting holes in an old scissors jack and mounted it on a 12 inch long piece of 2x8. There is about 7 inches clearance between "rungs" on Rohn 25, so as long as your jack collapses sufficiently, it works. If you don't have a spare scissors jack laying around, use the one in your car . It can do double duty. The rope between the two pieces of 2x8 is a good idea if you use it while up on a tower.

## Another tip:

Remember back when rebuilding an automobile brake wheel cylinder was just part of doing the brake job on your car?



Well that same tool has another use; Deburring the inside diameter of new, or used Rohn Tower Sections prior to assembly. A smooth ID makes for an easy fit and using the Brake Hone. Chuck it into a variable speed drill, run it for 10 to 15 Seconds and you have a fully deburred (Available from auto parts stores and Harbor Freight for about \$10).

## YCCC Awards Program Preliminary Results

Working with electronic data supplied by the contest sponsors, the YCCC Awards Manager AI, KE1FO has generated the following lists of winners for the three categories of awards. Awards are given for scores in the four major contests, CQWW DX SSB & CW; and ARRL DX SSB & CW.

BEFORE you jump down to look for your callsign, please understand that at this time the process is only partially automated. **Operator and station owners from multi-operator entries have to be manually tracked and evaluated. If you were an operator or station owner at a multioperator entry and you do not see your call listed where you believe it should be, please contact AI KE1FO at ([ke1fo@arrl.net](mailto:ke1fo@arrl.net)) to check your eligibility.**

To receive an award, members must have their dues paid up to date. Awards will be given out at the upcoming October meeting. YCCC will not mail awards to winners; we prefer that you attend the meeting to receive your award, but we will give your awards to others at the meeting to bring to you.

### Participation Awards

A member will be eligible for a Participation Award upon submitting club score entries for any 4 of the major contests. If a member enters a score for all 4 majors in the same year, this award can be achieved in the first year. Entries are lifetime cumulative, and once a member has entered 4 scores they are eligible for the award no matter how many years it took them to achieve. This is to provide for operators who choose to only operate a single mode. The member will receive only one award for the first achievement of the award.

### Improvement Awards

Eligibility for Improvement Recognition will be determined on a year over year basis. To determine improvement, a member's combined SSB and CW score for the current year for either CQWW or ARRL DX, will be compared to the same score for the previous year. To be eligible for an "improvement" award, you must have contributed an official score of at least 50K for the same contest the previous year. Improvement awards would be based on official published results using the following scale:

Previous Year's Score	Improvement Eligibility
50k-100k	100%
100-250k	50%
250k-1meg	25%
1meg-2meg	15%
2meg +	5%

### Achievement Awards

Each member's total contribution to the club score for the year will be totaled. There will be awards for 250K, 500K, 1 Meg, and 2 Meg or over total points contributed to the club in the contesting year. The awards for Achievement will be color-coded YCCC pins. The color coding will be as follows:

250K <b>Green</b>	2Meg Yellow
500K <b>Red</b>	5Meg Silver
1Meg <b>Blue</b>	10Meg Gold

**Family Member** - \$0 (Grants full membership to all amateurs residing at one domicile on payment of one member's "Full Member" annual dues and entitlement to one Club Newsletter sent to one domicile or email address. All members of said family are eligible for YCCC awards programs.)

**Student Member** - \$10 (Grants full membership to students at a reduced level. Eligible for YCCC awards programs and paper or electronic delivery of the Club Newsletter.)

**Subscription** - \$\*\* (A "friend of YCCC" - not a member but a possible candidate for future membership. Receives club newsletter only in paper or electronic form. Fee basis is \$20 for overseas paper delivery, \$15 for domestic paper delivery and \$10 for electronic "Ebutt" delivery domestically or overseas.)
