From the west, Rt. 125 or Rt. 101: East on Rt. 101 to Rt. 125 South. Approximately 7 miles down Rt. 125, then left turn on Rt. 107 (not Rt. 107A) and follow for 4 miles. House is on right after passing the Kensington town line / Apple Hill Golf course.

This amendment is intended to make the YCCC Hall of Fame Award a permanent part of the clubs culture. Awards programs have come and gone, but by creating a new ByLaw to describe the Hall of Fame Award, YCCC can have a permanent Award in place for those who should be recognized for their long term contributions.

This ByLaw change will be brought before the membership for a vote at the Boxboro General Meeting.

11. Hall of Fame Award

Upon nomination by a member in good standing and unanimous approval by the current Officers, Awards Manager, and Advisory Council of YCCC, another present or past member may be inducted into the YCCC Hall of Fame to recognize that member's superior long-term achievements and contributions to the club and contesting.

The nominating member shall provide a biography of the candidate to support the nomination. If approved, the induction shall be announced at the next General Meeting where the nominator shall be asked to present the biography of the inductee.

The award will include a wood plaque presented to the inductee, Honorary Life Membership, and posting of the inductee's biography and other relevant accomplishments on the YCCC Hall of Fame listing on the YCCC website.

In Memory of John H. Thompson, W1BIH/PJ9JT March, 1915 – March, 2012

John Thompson, W1BIH/PJ9JT was an avid contester and DXer. Over the past 70 plus years, he rarely missed a major contest, operating from his home station, W1BIH, the Connecticut Wireless Association during Field Day, or from one of the PJ islands. He even managed to get on in the VK/ZL contest one year when visiting the gang down under. John's enthusiasm and dedication to the sport of contesting was strong. His first love was CW, but he was no stranger to SSB contesting and was been quite active in the RTTY contests as well!

John was licensed in 1931. Starting in 1933 he was an operator at W1YK, the Worcester Polytechnic Institute where he served as club president among other offices held. After moving into his new home in Torrington, CT in August, 1940, John's contesting activities really

blossomed. He was a regular and ardent participant in all the major HF contests, both domestic and DX. John was an early member of the Connecticut Wireless Association, a small band of ardent operators in Central Connecticut who made Field Day their own with a long string of first and second place finishes in the 1, 2 and 3 transmitter-class. In 1963 and again in 1965, John was a member of the DXpeditions to Sint Maarten (PJ5ME) sponsored by the CWA. Operating during the ARRL CW DX Contest, this group placed first in the world in 1966 in the multi-multi-category.

From 1971 to 2000, John operated from his home in Curacao where he regularly participated in the CQ WW 160 meter contests, ARRL 160, ARRL DX and CQ WPX contests. For 6 years before that, John had operated from Curacao from the Coral Cliff hotel, owned and operated by Chet, PJ9EE. John was instrumental in the many PJ DXpeditions during CQWW Phone and CW contests, either as an operator, organizer or as a source of a location from which others have operated.

When John wasn't contesting, he spent time giving novices a crack at the PJ9 prefix, spending at least one hour per day operating the novice bands (Bernie, W3UR commented that as a novice he had worked John on 15 meters). RTTY and satellite operating were also a part of John's activities from PJ9JT. When the solar flux was higher, John would attempt QSOs during the VHF contests as well. As a long-time member of the First-Class CW Operator's Club (FOC) you would find John an active member on the bands. During the first weekend of February, he joined in the fray during the annual Marathon, which he's won for South America for 20 years or more.

When he wasn't contesting, John is "Elmering" his grandson, Alan who, in 1994, was already sending and receiving at 5 wpm. Today Alan is N1TKZ.

John was a superior DXer, with a total of 390 confirmed (367 on phone). In 2006 at the age of 90, he worked his last country, 3Y0X on Peter 1 Island. The event was video-taped and is available at:

At DX dinners where the custom is to have a countdown where everyone with 300 confirmed would stand up. As the number went up (310, 320, etc.) you sat down when the number was higher than your total. John was usually the last one standing.

In 1994, John's achievements were recognized when he was inducted into the CQ Magazine Contest Hall of Fame as the 14th member where he joined a very elite group of accomplished contesters.

From the Caribbean Contesting Consortium (PJ2T) web page:

From 1971 until 2000, John Thompson, W1BIH, owned his QTH at Coral Cliffs on the island of Curacao. The home became known arguably as one of the most famous contesting and DX locations in the world. The operator list during those decades was a "Who's Who" of contesting. Even Vic Clark, W4KFC, has operated from this location. In 1989, RadioTeam Finland operated PJ9W to an all-time record in the CQWW SSB contest from a field immediately adjacent to this house.

John's place, which came to be known as PJ9JT, has been the site of many world-high titles. In 1970, PJ0FC operated in CQWW CW, with the call licensed to Vic Clark, W4KFC. That team included W2TA, K4BAI, W4BRB (W4OO), K4BVD/6 (W6OAT), PA0VDV (PJ2VD), W4DQS (W4QM), W4GF, W4KFC, and K4SHB (N4TO). In 1996, 1997 and 1998 the station won the Multi/Single category of the ARRL CW DX contest, with W1BIH and W1WEF at the helm.

Incredibly, all of this was accomplished with a tribander and wires, attesting to the magic of the location.

John was a hero to many. An example of what a great ham should be. He was always humble and never really spoke of his accomplishments unless pressed, but he always delighted in telling great stories of the various adventures. He will be greatly missed by his many friends.

YCCC General Meeting Minutes Sturbridge, MA - March 31, 2012

President Tony K1KP called the meeting to order at 12:15 pm.

A roll call of the 80 members and guests was followed by the Secretary's report, which the February meeting minutes were published in the Scuttlebutt. A motion was made to accept the minutes as published in the Scuttlebutt by K1XM, Seconded by W1UE, the motion carried. A slide of members that will be dropped from the roster was shown.

Next K1EP presented the treasurer's report. K1XM made a motion to accept the report, which was seconded by W1UE, the motion carried

Tony asked if there was any new business. Paul K1XM said he wanted to make a motion for honorary life membership for W1AX and N4XR as outlined in section 7 of the clubs by-laws. This was seconded by K1KP, the motion carried.

Next President Tony K1KP did a "Presidents State of the Club Address" which he talked about the traveling meetings. He had several slides showing the various meeting locations with a breakdown of the attendance at each. He found that the meetings in the center of the clubs territory had the greatest attendance, but holding meetings away from the center does bring out more nearby members to attend. Tony also talked about the success of the three contest universities that were held. They were attended by 72 members and we welcomed 12 new members as a result of them. There were several quotes by those who have attended one like

"For whatever it's worth, roughly half of my Q total is a direct result of the Contest University session on the use of the cluster. Getting a clue on filtering and the N1MM integration was definitely worth the price of admission". AB10D and

"This was really my first serious effort at a big contest from home and I consciously tried to bring together all of the advice I had picked up at the Contest University and apply it over the weekend. What a difference it made. I think these were the key things I took away from CU that really improved my score". WIMSW

Tony talked about the recreation of the awards program, which if a member submits a score in the four major contests they receive a hat. Then the Improvement award which encourages a member to improve on last year's score and the achievement award which focuses on long term score achievements.

Lessons learned: do not ever have a meeting on a religious holiday and you do not sell raffle tickets at a Ham flea market. Tony had several trivia slides recapping his year as president. Next Tony thanked the Officers, The advisory council W1WEF and K1RX, all the area managers, Scorekeeper K1HT, Awards Manager KE1FO, Webmaster WB1CCL, Media Manager W1TJL, Scuttlebutt Editor N1SR, Scuttlebutt Publisher WB1DX, W1 QSL Bureau manager W1RZF.

A goal for the upcoming year is to grow the membership as there every contest is setting all time participation records.

In closing the address Tony said a thank you to the members who put in the time in front of the radios, up the towers, and everywhere in between. Teamwork Makes the Dream Work!!

Announcements:

Tony K1KP presented the gavel for the 2010 ARRL 160 meter contest to Mark K1RX who was President at the time.

Dennis W1UE is now a Contest Advisory Committee member representing New England.

Dennis W1UE is also a member of the Boxboro Committee. Dennis announced that the Friday DX Dinner speaker is Don N1DG, and Saturday afternoon there will be a joint contest forum and YCCC meeting.

Mark K1RX will be hosting a BBQ on June 2 at his QTH. He will be setting up the Derrick system which will be used at the upcoming WRTC 2014 station sites.

Tony K1KP announced that Dave K1HT who has served a score keeper since 1996 would like to pass the baton. Dave has been a tremendous go to resource for the club regarding contest rules, and scores.

Tony Announced that Alec W2JU will be taking over the scorekeeper duties.

Alec W2JU gave an update on the scores to date for the ARRL DX contests. The current 2012 total is 245 Million points which is more than 2011 total of 209 Million points. Alec also pointed out that there were 19 logs showing their score is going to the YCCC but have not been reported to the scorekeeper or on 3830.

Tony K1KP then moved to the nominations for officers. He announced that after 10 years as treasurer K1EP would like to step down, however the rest of the current officers are willing to stay in their current positions. He opened the nomination to the floor. K1XM made a motion to nominate Chet N8RA as treasurer and current officers. This was seconded by W1QA. Tony then asked if there were any further nominations. Hearing none he closed nominations and turning the meeting over to Brian NJ1F to conduct the election. Brian NJ1F then opted to conduct an open vote. The proposed slate of officers was unanimously elected.

Tony K1KP then introduced John W1FV who gave a presentation titled "Compact High performance receiving arrays for the low bands". John described his findings that three close spaced short vertical antennas when properly phased can approximate the performance of a 800 to 900 foot beverage on 160. The design is modular allowing it to be scaled from 3, 5 or 9 vertical elements allow for additional azimuths directions. This is going to be the next YCCC club project and will consist of the following:

- Amplifiers for the base of the vertical elements
- Phase Controller Box

- Directional Controller Box

- Feed Line Chokes

These will include the printed circuit boards, components, connectors, and enclosures. Bruce WW1M is the PCB designer for the project.

Final pricing is not set yet but so far the 3 element kit will be around \$170, the 5 element kit will be around \$285, and the 9 element around \$445

The phasing lines might be offered as an option and are not included in the above pricing.

John will be posting updates about the project to the reflector and his entire presentation on the YCCC website. John has on order the prototype boards and parts on order and will be assembling a couple of kits and verify the design in the coming weeks. Dennis W1UE will be handling the ordering and has set up the following email address CircleArray@verizon.net. They hope to be able to start taking orders for kits in the next 4 to 6 weeks.

Tony then called for a 15 minute break.

Tony then reconvened the meeting and asked the three prospective members to introduce themselves. W1UE made a motion to accept Fred AB1QC, Anita AB1QB and Ted N9NB as members, K1XM seconded and by unanimous vote, they were welcomed aboard.

Tony then announced the creation of the Yankee Clipper Contest Hall of Fame. He outlined the criteria for the selection and showed the plaques the inductees will receive. He announced that the first members of the Hall of Fame are W1BIH, W1AX and N4XR. He then asked for the member who nominated each to come forward and tell about the honoree.

W1BIH John H. Thompson was nominated by Jack W1WEF however due to illness Jack was not able to attend the meeting. K1RX read the letter that Jack had written. Sadly John W1BIH passed away before this honor could be bestowed but his daughter and son in-law W1AZ were at the meeting and accepted the award.

W1AX Roger E. Corey was nominated by W1FJ who read his nomination letter. W1AX was not able to attend the meeting due to his XYL being ill. W1FJ will give W1AX the award.

N4XR Victor W. Paounoff was nominated by KB1H who told us about Vic's many accomplishments. Vic now lives in Gettysburg PA and KB1H and a group of members are planning a trip to visit N4XR and will present the award.

Tony then introduced K1DG to give an update on WRTC-2014. Half way thru the qualifying contests and many of those on top of the North America leader board are YCCCers. They are actively acquiring sites and will be testing the sites to make sure that they are equal as possible during this year's IARU contest. The group will be deciding on the triband antenna in the coming weeks. Doug then introduced Tom K1KI who has been tasked with finding 65 sites. Tom outlined typical site characteristics they are looking for and announced that they are planning on being on from 15 sites in this summer's IARU contest. Tom is looking for volunteers to man the sites. Tom then introduced Mark K1RX who talked about the antenna system called the falling derrick. Mark showed a video of the tower being raised in his front yard with five people. All antennas and rotor will be installed while the tower is on the ground and there will be no need for anyone to climb a tower.

Doug talked about fund raising and said that in addition to clubs sponsoring stations, several groups of individuals memorial stations, including one for KC1F and W2PV.

Doug introduced Rich N6KT, as Doug pointed out Rich has won CQWW SSB for the world 9 times and was the first single op to make more than 10,000 qso's in a single contest. Rich gave a presentation on his recent operation in the WPX SSB contest from D44RS's station.

Subscription - \$** (A "friend of YCCC" - not a member but a possible candidate for future membership. Receives club newsletter only in paper or electronic form. Fee basis is \$20 for overseas paper delivery, \$15 for domestic paper delivery and \$10 for electronic "Ebutt" delivery domestically or overseas.)
