Giving Something Back

For some reason, which defies logical explanation, we all enjoy running pile-ups. Most of us enjoy chasing after multipliers, many of us enjoy erecting monster antenna arrays or optimizing the station computer hardware and software for efficient contesting. Did you notice the common thread running through all the above? What these are, are examples of ways we derive *personal* gratification from our contesting activities. However, just as in life, there is no free lunch. A successful contest and DX community also needs us to help our fellow YCCC members and other amateurs as well, in connection with a host of activities that most of us have grown to depend on.

Fortunately, this club is large and diverse enough that the choice of non-operating activities is fairly large and there ought to be something to suit almost everyone. First and foremost (and my favorite) is the idea that you could run for a club office. Year after year, all of the offices have one-candidate elections, usually resulting from the outgoing officers "drafting" barely enough people to fill the open slots. This does not have to be. We have almost 300 members. Come on, folks! We also have numerous appointed positions, such as scorekeeping, jacket and badge coordinators, and area manager positions. While each of these positions is currently occupied by someone, things change and openings will occur. I hope it's easier to find volunteers than was often the case in the past.

We have an extensive PacketCluster system, and the SYSOPS who operate the various nodes do an outstanding job. Node maintenance can take up a great deal of time and the service the club performed by these members is substantial.

And then there is the QSL bureau. The bureau is sponsored by YCCC, but not all the sorters are YCCC members. When vacancies occur, it would be nice if there were more Club members ready and willing to take over a letter.

Incredibly, there are a few members who participate in almost every area I've just mentioned. I don't know when these people get a chance to operate, and if there were some more volunteers they might get on the air a little more.

I've identified about 75 positions of possible contribution to the Club. I see no reason why *every* member shouldn't find a way to help out in some area or other at least every third year or so. Otherwise, you're getting a free ride. Our dues are nominal, and we really have no problem with finances. What we really need is your *time*. (And if you think I'm trying to make some of you feel guilty, you're right!)

I hope lots of you attend the ARRL New England Division Convention in New Hampshire on the 24th. Vice-President Saul Abrams, K2XA, has put together an excellent meeting program, and ARRL Vice-Director Warren Rothberg, WB1HBB, has organized an outstanding convention. I won't be able to be there, but I'll see you all at the August picnic.

Secretary's Report Yankee Clipper Contest Club

The June, 1993, meeting of the Yankee Clipper Contest Club was held on Sunday, June 6, at the Sturbridge Host Hotel in Sturbridge, Massachusetts. After club president Rich, K2WR, called the meeting to order, he read a series of announcements. Rich announced that the new ARRL DXCC list has all the new countries, as well as a list of DXCC field checkers. Club vice president Saul, K2XA, listed highlights of upcoming meetings. The October pre-contest-season meeting will feature Dean, N6BV, with propagation predictions for the CQ WW contests. The tentative technical speaker for the December meeting is Frank Donovan, W3LPL, on solar propagation effects. The August meeting is, as usual, the club picnic. The extra July meeting at the ARRL New England Division Convention will star Charlie, WZ1R, on multi-multi WPX contesting from KY1H, Ed, K1TR, on VHF contesting, Don, WB2DND, on HF contesting from the Middle East, and Charlie, K1XX, on packet cluster updates. Rich also showed off his new Heil ProSet headset (\$135). He likes the better sound isolation of the new headphones, but we also noted that he has the headset's leads wrapped on toroid chokes.

After introductions of the 53 members present, Charlie, WZ1R, talked about club callsign badges, and distributed those ordered at the last meeting. Len, KB2R, then discussed club jackets, to be made by Doug Zwiebel, KR2Q. At Len's recommendation, the club voted to go with embroidered rather than screen-printed logo on the back, and authorized up to

\$400 from the club treasury to produce the master logo embroidery tape, which can be used for all future embroidered clothing. Jackets ordered at the meeting or before may be available by the ARRL NE Division Convention, and otherwise will be available by the club picnic. Following this discussion, the club voted into membership returnee Jason, N1GKI, and new member Howie, WB2CPU.

Several club members had items for sale during the commercial break. Ken, W1NG, had the KD7P LogPlus program for \$35, plus \$3 for IOTA data. Radiokit (Carl, KM1H) had ferrite super-beads for \$2 (\$1 going to the packet cluster fund) and silver-plated PL259s for \$1. Radiokit donated a total of \$47 to the packet cluster fund from the sale of the super beads. Radiokit is also collecting a Rohn tower order; contact Carl. Jack, W1WEF, had computer-controlled CW radio interfaces for K8CC, K1EA, and N6TR software for \$20. Paul, NX1P, had computer interface cables, which do not require a separate power supply, for \$50. Dean, N6BV, authored a new book on propagation, available from LTA Industries (K3LR's company) for \$50.

Dean, N6BV, also announced that he is joining the ARRL to edit their Antenna Compendium. Rich, K2WR, announced the Scuttlebutt won an "excellent" rating from the Amateur Radio News Service.

Bill, K1MM, then presented this year's Contest Quiz. This year's winner, Charlie, WZ1R, will write next year's Quiz.

After the break, Charlie, K1XX, gave an update on the packet system. WU1I, on 145.71, now covers Southeast Connecticut and reaches into Long Island. KD2EU, in Portland, Maine, is on 144.91. K1UO, in Bangor, Maine, connected to KD2EU, is currently on 144.91 but will move to 144.97 soon. Node KY1H now signs AA1AS (same location). Larry, K1UO, needs a 220 radio to improve his connection to KD2EU; call Larry or Charlie if you can help. The main spring project has been installing 440 antennas on the packet backbone to help with ice problems.

Saul, K2XA, has a source of cheap guy wire deadends in both 1/4" and 3/16", for about \$2. Assistant club scorekeeper

Charlie, WZ1R, continued to collect WPX contest scores, noting 60M points collected for the club so far. Charlie is also organizing sprint teams (10 members) for September and NAQP teams (5 members) for August. Call him if you plan to operate either contest. Following this, we watched the FRC station and antenna video, shown at Dayton this spring.

YCCC: Its Birth and the Early Years - Part IV Jeff Briggs, K1ZM

[In the last 'Butt, we reviewed the process by which MM and NECC would choose whether to disband and form a new club. Two meetings would be held; MM would vote first and, if approved, NECC would vote at a separate meeting two days later. Things were going well when, on the night of the MM meeting, freezing rain and a snowstorm hit the Northeast. It was too late to cancel the meeting so the decision was made to "roll the dice" and see what would happen. In this issue, we rejoin the story first with the highlights of the MM meeting followed by the NECC side of the story.]

Highlights of the MM Meeting

The drive up to Newington was pretty awful and, upon arriving, there were several more phone messages waiting for me. These were from guys who had called ARRL HQ to let me know they did not want to risk driving to the meeting. A couple of them wanted to know if they could vote "for" the merger by absentee ballot. I didn't think the by-laws allowed for this but I stuck their votes in my pocket anyway, just in case.

In spite of the weather, we had a surprising turnout - about 45 guys actually showed up for the meeting. It was the largest turnout MM had seen at a meeting in a long time; interest in the proposal was high and everyone knew that a vote on the club's future would be taken.

We decided to run the meeting as a "Town Meeting"; everyone was given a

chance to talk - as long and as often as they wanted. We also did not set any fixed time limit on discussion. When everyone had said what they wanted to say, we would take a vote by secret ballot.

For the most part, things were pretty civil. Only a couple of occasions did emotions and tempers really flare. One that I can remember was when someone made the mistake of criticizing the value of those members on the fringes of club territory. Saul, K2XA, jumped up and at first I thought he was going to punch the guy's lights out! The guy was reminded of the fact that W2PV was "one of those guys on the fringes of club territory!"

After about two hours of discussion, we were about to shut it down and put things to a vote. It was at this point that a few of those dead set against the merger took the floor and made their arguments. It was clear to me that there were some who really didn't want to see the old club fade away and be replaced by something new. I always respected their opinion and hoped that, if it went the other way when we voted, they would some day reconsider and come over to the new club.

Just before the vote was taken a few parliamentary rules had to be cleared up. The point was made that we could not vote ourselves out of existence. The second point raised was that the matter could not be brought up to a vote that night. The third point raised was that such a vote required a $\frac{2}{3}$ vote rather than a simple majority for passage.

A check was made of the by-laws and it was clear that the matter required advance publication in the club newsletter. This had been done well in advance of the meeting and it had been made perfectly clear in the newsletter that a vote on the merger would be the principal business matter to be conducted. The motion was dismissed.

A further check of the by-laws indicated that, one publicly announced, a vote of those present at the meeting was sufficient for passage. This motion was also dismissed.

Lastly, it was correct, however, that a $\frac{2}{3}$ majority of those present was indeed required for passage. This was an important point because it could have materially

impacted the outcome of the matter.

Finally, with the snow still coming down outside, the moment of truth was at hand. We put it to a vote and I personally crossed my fingers because it was impossible to predict where the "swing vote" would come out. I figured we had at least 50 of the votes but a $\frac{2}{3}$ majority was another matter!

I've forgotten the actual number but I believe the "yea" votes were on the order of 78% of the members present. The motion had passed and there was a moment of numbness in the part of many. You sort of wanted to jump up and cheer the moment but, in deference to those who had not carried the day, it was inappropriate. I was also mighty glad I did not need to attempt to raise the matter of the three absentee ballots I was holding in my pocket from K1XX, W1ZM, and K1DG!

I had managed to find and bring several cases of Coors to the meeting and we toasted a new beginning for the club - or so we hope. In those days, it was tough to find Coors East of the Mississippi River - it wasn't until a number of years later that it was generally available on the East coast. For the most part, it was a happy moment - I did overhear one of the sure "nay" voters comment that, "Gee, I never would have believed there could have been so much support for this motion. This was a surprise!" It was then that I realized that the days and weeks spent on the phone, patiently answering questions and explaining what we were trying to do to each and every member on the roster had undoubtedly won the day for a new start.

Two Days Later - NECC Makes Its Decision on the Merger

I drove up to the NECC meeting in Worcester and was introduced to the club members by Roger Burt, the club's president. Roger asked me to summarize the decision made at the MM meeting on Friday night, which I did. I told the group assembled that it was now up to them and yielded the floor to Roger for discussion.

Unfortunately for me, I had a commitment back in New York and only had about 1½ hours available before I had to leave the meeting. There was much dis-

cussion, some of it negative. The principal concern expressed was that NECC had just broken away from MM: why should the club get back together with the same group it had just left? What guarantees would there be that things really would be different? I left that to Roger to answer; it was his meeting and his show. I felt it was not my place to suggest to these guys what they should do; it was going to have to be their decision. I stayed as long as my time allowed and then headed back home to New York.

Later that night, Roger called and chatted aimlessly for about 45 seconds. Finally, when the suspense was about to kill me, I had to interrupt and ask him the outcome of the voting. He said, "Oh, yeah. It passed. No problem!" He said there were a few "nay" votes but that the measure had passed handily.

I was ecstatic and glad it was finally all over. After a few minutes the talk turned to planning for the unification meeting. Since I was not only MM's president but also its newsletter editor, of course a summary of the meeting outcome and future gameplan would have to be written up and distributed to all of the members of both clubs. This was done and we announced in the newsletter that the unification meeting would be held in about a month's time in Worcester. The agenda for the meeting was as follows:

- 1 Election of officers
- 2 Ratification of the new club constitution and by-laws
- 3 Selection of a club name
- 4 Appointment of regional club managers
- 5 Collection of required information to satisfy ARRL requirements for the club affiliation with the League

A Few Comments Looking Back Fifteen years

The events reported in these pages have been reported totally from memory without the use of aids or old newsletters. As a consequence, if I have overlooked anyone who played a key role or was present at one of the early planning meetings, please accept my apology.

It should also be stated, once again, that it was never anyone's intent through the formation of YCCC to denigrate the old MM club or any of its original members. MM had been a fine club but it seemed at the time to have lost the magic that had made it great. The actions taken to make a new beginning seemed, at the time, the best course of action to keep the club viable and position it for even greater success going forward.

Greasing Rohn TB3 Thrust Bearings

I just installed a new tower with a flat top section, and a TB3-B thrust bearing that was about five years old. This is the first time I've used a thrust bearing, and perhaps everyone else who has used the TB3 already knows how to grease them!

Mine seemed to rotate fine with no load, but I thought before I put it at the top of my 100 foot tower, I'd take it apart and repack it. On the inside of the sleeve that the mast slides into, there was a set screw which was rusty and loose. With the help of a little WD40, I got an allen wrench into the screw, and removed it. Along with the screw, out came a ball bearing! Soon, more ball bearings fell out of the screw hole, but none got away. One notable thing about the bearings... they were all bone dry!

I decided that instead of removing any more bearings, I would inject some white

lithium grease into the screw hole, and work it in by rotating the thrust bearing. With the space from the missing balls, I was able to poke in a good amount of grease, and then press the remaining balls back into place. I then thought I'd replace the set screw with a new one, but it appeared to be special with the bottom ground flat so as not to damage the balls. The reason it is left loose is so it doesn't jam the bearing.

Although I thought it turned pretty smooth before I started, it was much better with the new grease. I don't know if all TB3s are made this way, but I've heard of them seizing before, and wonder if they just need an occasional grease job! Sears sells a 2 ounce tube of white lithium grease for about \$2.

The Place to Find Club Information

DUES are due at the April election meeting, which begins our club "contest year", with a grace period until the end of June. Membership in the club will lapse at the end of the grace period if dues are not paid up. In order to re-join the club, a lapsed member must attend a meeting, like any new member, and be welcomed back into membership, or may become a subscriber to the Scuttlebutt by paying up (see below). Club members who move out of club territory and so are not eligible to contribute to club aggregate scores automatically become subscribers. New members who join at the last meeting of the club's contest year (February) are credited with dues for the following year (that is, the contest year beginning that April). You can tell if you owe dues by checking your 'Butt mailing label. Only paid-up members are eligible to contribute to the club score in contests.

FAMILY MEMBER Members of the same family living at the same address may elect to receive only one copy of the Scuttlebutt. One member of the family must pay full dues, enabling the rest of the family to join as family members. Being a family member is currently free.

STUDENT MEMBERS Full-time students are eligible for dues at half the regular rate.

SCUTTLEBUTT SUBSCRIBERS Anyone may subscribe to the club newsletter, the Scuttlebutt. A subscription currently costs \$10 per year. At the present time, overseas subscriptions cost the same as domestic (we have very few overseas subscribers). The subscription period begins at the beginning of the club year, in April. New subscribers who begin their subscriptions after the December issue are considered to have paid for the following year (that is, they receive as many issues as new members joining at that time do). You can tell if your subscription is current by checking your 'Butt mailing label. The grace period for late subscriptions is the same as for late memberships.
