Managers will, if you like, take your completed log and make sure it gets to CQ.

Probably 80% of YCCC members enter contests year after year with no hope or intention of winning, but enjoying it nonetheless. If you fall into this category, keep the club in mind and look for ways to maximize your score, even if it means competing in a different entry class. Remember, your can compete in a single-band category and submit a separate entry for the club with additional QSOs on other bands.

The October meeting went pretty well considering the reputation Boxboro enjoys in YCCC history. I'm glad to welcome fifteen new members all of whom we look forward to hearing in CQ WW. We were pleased to have Dick Ross, K2MGA (publisher of CQ), and Dave Sumner, K1ZZ (ARRL General Manager) at the meeting to present awards for last season's contests. Dick also offered CQ's apologies for the unflattering reference to YCCC in the 1981 CQ WW phone writeup. The writeup was the opinion of only the author, N6AR, not CQ. I have been assured by Bob Cox, K3EST, that the CQ club competition will continue as before, relying on the integrity of the clubs involved, rather than giving us a new set of rules to live with.

Thanks to those of you who helped out in the sorting of W2PV QSL cards. Please bring them or arrange to have them brought to the next meeting.

A couple significant votes were taken at the October meeting. One moved our regular December meeting to November 13. This presents us with a chance to induct new members before the CQ WW cw weekend (and avoids scheduling a meeting on a contest weekend). A second vote was taken on whether YCCC should put a major effort into SS. "Don't care" won over "yes" and "no" by a 2 to 1 margin. Consequently anyone who operates SS is encouraged to submit a log in YCCC's name, but don't lose any sleep if you don't get on.

Pat, W2YX, drew credits for his contributions to work reported in last the IEEE Journal of Electromagnetic Compatibility.

Rich, K1CC, will be active single-op as YV3BRF (or possibly a special call) 1.8 (at 0600Z) through 28 MHz in the CQ WW cw contest. Look for Rich during the week after the contest on 10 MHz, if permission is granted. QSLs via YV3AJ.

Conversations with the folks at CQ confirm that 10 MHz QSOs will not count in the CQ WW, although the exclusion is not specifically stated in the printed rules.

We have no details on our new members yet but here's the list (October): AA1M, AB1U, K1TR, K5NA, KA1BRD, KA1CDC, KA1CDX, KA1DWX, KA1FBY, KA1GG, N3MC, W1AJ, WA1HXH, WB1FVS, WB2JSJ, WB2ZKX, AND K1CC; (November): K1JX, KA2AEV, N2GC, KB2MG, AA2Z, and K9HI.

The pileup tape competition at the November meeting was won by John, K1AR, who produced a score of 41 (good calls minus 3 times bad calls). John says that sitting next to the speaker had nothing to do with his high rate, but the next highest score was 33 by Rich, K1CC.

Jim, N2JJ, is working frantically to get his new Moonraker beam into action on 10 meters for the CQ WW.

John, K2VV, ahas sked for input to the CQ WW Contest Committee regarding potential club rules changes. The prevailing opinion at the November meeting seemed to be that there is no need to fix something that isn't broken. Perhaps the local ARRL CAC representative will be spurred to produce the review of the history behind the ARRL club rules which he has been working on for three years.

AWARDS CORNER

The Awards Committee (AK1A, WB8BTH, KM1C) has streamlined and simplified the YCCC Awards Program. The first presentations were made at the meeting in November with the following guidelines:

- Certificates will be given to the YCCC Top Ten Single Operators in each of the six major contests. Certificates will also be given to each Operator participating in the top YCCC entry in the Multi-Single and Multi-Multi categories. These Awards will normally be given at the first YCCC meeting following publication of contest results.
- 2. When the scores are out for the entire contest year (Fall thru Spring Contests), certificates will be given to the Top 25 Operators in the YCCC for that year. These will be based on the combined points made by individuals for that contest year, whether made as Single-Op, Multi-Single, Multi-Multi, or any combination thereof. (The Awards Committee will make all point determinations based on published Call Signs and Scores.) The Top Point-Producing Operator for the year will be given an engraved YCCC Plaque.
- A Clipper-Ship Trophy will be given to any Operator reach a cumulative year to year individual score of 25 Million Points.
- 4. Scores from the respective contests will be weighted for the YCCC Awards Program as follows:

CQ WW Score x 1 (one)
SS Score x 10 (ten)
ARRL DX Score x 2 (two)

The above program is intended to promote operator activity within the YCCC ranks. The Awards Committee may from time to time give out additional awards where special effort and/or merit are concerned.

Any problems with published scores (inaccurate or missing scores, missing call signs, etc.) should be referred to Dick Newell, AK1A, on a timely basis.



Audio Switching

The accompanying diagram shows another little box, a box of the type often found on contester operating desks. It is usually (and is in this case) made by Bud, and of cast aluminum with rounded edges.



It was first built to permit two operators who were working the same band to listen to each other's receivers. Another application was to permit the 80 meter phone operator to keep a receiver on 3640 and to check it once in a while, without upsetting the preselector tuning in use on a transceiver or receiver.

After a while, it became obvious that the same box could be used in peacetime to permit simultaneous listening to the local DX repeater and to 3830 or whatever other low band activity was of interest.

Note that a 10 ohm resistor knocks down the audio output of each receiver. That in itself isn't much of a problem, unless you wish to driver a speaker. The resistor provides a little protection for the audio amplifier, so that the other receiver won't get into it.

The problem is that when mixing the receivers (I use each receiver's volume control to set the levels), a mushy sound develops out of the mismatch. Others (this means K1GQ) have noticed the same problem.

DEAR READER: Have you got a solution to the problem of mixing two receivers, keeping the switching flexibility, and retaining enough output to driver a speaker? Your contribution to this knotty problem will be warmly received.

Bill, W1HCS, finally made it and is now KM1C. Congratulations Bill!

K7RI Tips

- SET A GOAL: Do so BEFORE contest! Keep summary sheet with the goal in front of you throughout the contest and monitor your progress toward that goal working harder, if necessary, to reach goal.
- Make a list of DX peditions that will be on. List their calls and zone number & country for quick reference. Keep the list on hand so you can monitor it and not miss the easy DX peditions.
- Always use GMT (UTC) and pencil log entries are much easier to erase than those logged in ink.
- Be sure to log calls correctly...especially JAs with their multitude of different prefixes.
- 5. Op Aids: Dup/Zone Check-Off Sheets for each band; be sure to keep them up to date during the contest (but don't bother to dup JAs until after contest and don't bother duping Ws at all, as they are zero points anyway); Summary Sheet with goal on it & list of DXpeditions. USE THESE AIDS CONTINUOUSLY DURING CONTEST TO KNOW WHAT YOU ARE MISSING AND FIND AND WORK IT!!
- Scoring QSO Points: North America (zones 1-8 inclusive) are 2 points; all other zones (9-40 inclusive) are 3 points; USA & duplicate DX contacts are ZERO POINTS.
- Be able to know at a glance at the dup/zone sheets what mults are missing (unworked) on each band.
- BEFORE contest, use CQ & other printed sources of propagation information to get an idea of what countries/zones will be likely to come in — and at what time and beam headings.
- Get CQ Zone Map (or whatever) showing what countries are in what zones so you can tell at a glance what countries are in the "missing" zone you haven't worked yet.
- Install a foot switch, if possible, BEFORE the contest.
 Less fatigue and better timing of calls.
- BE SURE, DON'T MISS ZONES 3, 4, & 5, on ANY BAND YOU OPERATE. All are USA & most are easy to work.
- 12. Logging: Simplify it. Give everyone same report. Enter it only once at top and bottom of page, indicating with arrow that all reports are the same. Fill in the time only every 5 minutes, or so, and fill in by guess-timate after contest. Also, don't write full 4 digits of time for every QSO. Only enter the hour once at beginning of hour and enter the minutes only for the rest of that hour then start again with next hour (i.e., 2100,01,02).
- DONT'T MISS EASY MULTIPLIERS!!! i.e., USA,
 VE, KH6, KL7, etc., Zones 3, 4, & 5.
- BEFORE contest, put up a quarter wave sloper on the carribean (and JA too, if possible).
- Use TWO alarm clocks: one next to bed and one across room so you won't turn it off and go back to sleep again — missing openings.

- 16. AFTER contest, review strange prefixes and calls with someone else; also, look for possible multipliers you worked and logged but overlooked entering for credit as a new multiplier.
- 17. Watch Out for the "helpful" tip about the rare one up the band. This occurs most often when you have control of a most productive frequency and your benefactor wants it!
- 18. Rule of Thumb: Work highest open band at any time, but be sure to rotate to other bands at least every hour (more often preferably) so as not to miss an opening elsewhere.
- 19. Avoid working W stations after you have W & the 3 zones on each band. Remember, all QSOs with USA count ZERO POINTERS and, unless you need him (or he you) it is counterproductive.
- 20. 160 Meter schedules occur on the hour starting as early as 10 or 11 PM. The best time is our sunrise, and the 3 AM time period. DON'T transmit in the "DX Window": 1825-1830!
- 21. Be aware of trade-off of working more QSOs versus more multipliers late in contest. It is more productive to take longer to work a new mult sometimes than to work a handfull of JAs (QSOs). Rough rule: Total QSOs divided by total mults at that time tells how many QSOs you must work to equal in score the productivity of one new multiplier.
- 22. Develop your own European pile-ups; the same is true for JA & Africa, if possible.
- 23. When acknowledging a call from a JA (or anyone), repeat back to him the same identical phonetics he used when calling you. Be sure to log call correctly; don't guess!
- 24. If when running JAs, you get only a part of his call, but are sure of that part, repeat ONLY the part you are positive of. JAs are excellent ops & only the station with the part of the call you ask for will call you back. Then you will get all of his call & proceed to the next one. i.e., You hear: "J 1 Charlie". You say: "Only the station J 1 with the Charlie in the call"
- 25. If JA pile-up is too deep and it is difficult to make out any calls, try reducing your rf gain as to hear only stronger stations. If that doesn't work, call for districts only, or certain prefixes only. i.e., JA1, JE1, JR1 only or 1, 2, 3, etc. only.
- 26. Work the really rare station who is not in contest when you hear him. Don't go away & hope to find hinm later. Spend additional time NOW, provided, of course, he is a new multiplier not likely to show-up in the contest. i.e., ST2SA & Zone 34. He's worth the extra time NOW!!!
- Interrupt your runs at least every 30-45 minutes & search for new mults on that band.
- 28. DON'T BLOODY YOURSELF in pile-ups the first day, or even early Saturday. The really big contesters & DXpeditions will be there the entire contest and are very easy to work on Sunday.
- 29. If there is a really deep pile-up on a common country or zone, which you need for a mult, look around the

- band. You likely will find another KH6, KL7, etc. who has just come on and there is no pile-up yet.
- 30. ALSO, don't fight propagation! When the west coast, or whatever part of the country other than us seems to get through every time and a few or no other east coast or locals are making it, go do something else more productive. Progation WILL CHANGE and maybe an hour or so later (or more) will favor 1-land...and you'll get the same guy on the same frequency on the 1st call. BE SURE TO MAKE A NOTE OF HIS CALL & FREQUENCY SO YOU CAN FIND HIM LATER (if he's still there.) Check back periodically to see how propagation is changing!!!
- 31. Judge your pile-up breaking ability against comparable locals, not the west coast, etc. — or someone locally you know has a much stronger signal in that direction. If he isn't making it, chances are you won't either. Let him bloody himself; you go elsewhere more productive and come back later.
- 32. Try hard to keep your frequency when productively running Europeans (or whomever). Often someone else will try to take your frequency away from you. DON'T JUST GIVE UP!!! He wants it because it is working for you & he thinks he may have similar success. There was the story of the W6 who was running JAs. A W5 came on frequency and tried to take it away from him. He turned his beam down the 5's throat and pretended to continue running JAs. The 5 couldn't hear anything but the 6 and left the frequency. Such a deal!!!
- 33. A high percentage of JAs on Sunday will be dupes (zero points). Also, Sunday here is Monday in Japan and most of the JAs are at work (not the rig). Perhaps a better choice is to look for multipliers. You have to make this determination yourself at the time by evaluating the trade-off between additional QSOs versus additional multipliers (covered above).
- 34. PILE UPS THAT ARE DOUBLE MULTIPLIERS
 (NEW ZONE & COUNTRY) ARE TWICE AS
 VALUABLE AS SINGLE MULTS. YOUR CAN
 WELL-AFFORD TO SPEND ADDITIONAL TIME
 (TWICE AS MUCH) ON SUCH A STATION AS A
 SINGLE MULT.
- 35. BANDS WHICH YOU HAVE WORKED THE LEAST AFFORD THE GREATEST OPPORTUNITY TO WORK DOUBLE MULTS!!!
- 36. Be sure to work at least the "cheap ones" on 40, 75, 160. i.e., W, VE, Zones 3, 4, & 5.
- 37. 10 KC from that loud KP4 with the huge pile-up is a weak KP4, with no pile-up. Work him instead.
- 38. GET YOUR 40/80/160 MULTIPLIERS THE FIRST NIGHT!!! DX ops often sleep part of the 2nd night, and aren't available then — hence we miss them.
- 39. Be patient on the low bands!!! YV4TI, etc., is nice copy on 40 when the contest begins, but not easy to work, if at all, to perhaps as late as midnight or later.
- 40. GET FAMILIAR WITH THE BANDS IN THE WEEKS BEFORE THE CONTEST. Who is on what frequencies & when.

- JAs on 75 are at 3793-3803, rarely anymore working split at 3535-95 listening up to 3800+.
- 42. Unless conditions are outstanding, JAs on 40/75 will peak and go down several times a night. If you have trouble, come back later, it may be much better only 30 minutes (or more) later.
- 43. Average Stations: Stay in a clear frequency. If your pile-up disappears, move to another frequency and start over again someone you can't hear has probably taken your frequency. This may happen often but you must accept it and keep moving. At the beginning of the contest a lot of stations are calling CQ (DX stations). Work them. Good rates are available doing this during the early hours of the contest. When the big stations move to other bands, take advantage of their absence and may hay of the band they left.
- 44. Morning long path on 40/80 is tough! If your working JAs on those bands, forget the long path.
- 45. 80 CW LACK OF ACTIVITY

- 46. From 9 PM to 3 AM it is sometimes possible to work Aftrica beaming long path over ZL/YK up through JA...the path changes as the evening progresses. This occurs on BOTH 20 and 15.


