Ponderings From the Poop Deck

A stray phrase in a recent **Murphy Message** caught my attention: "... (MM) has never been a big-bucks outfit..." Anyone who has followed N1TZ's reports knows that YCCC is never far from the the poorhouse, but it somehow seems that \$10 dues from 100+ members ought to give us more fiscal security. Since this newsletter is our single largest expense, I thought I would itemize typical payments.

First Class postage for up to six pages is 18 cents (probably going up to 23 cents later this year). Periodically, Cushcraft picks up the postage tab in exchange for inserting a page of advertising (they provide the inserts). Our mailing list hovers around 200, so the Post Office gets about \$36.

Preparation of camera-ready originals is basically no cost to YCCC. Rarely, I will bill the club for materi-

als such as dry-transfer lettering, mailing labels, etc.

Offset printing is done at a Cambridge quick copy shop, Gnomen Copy, entirely because they are the least expensive offset place we have found. **Butt** 33 cost about \$43, or 21.4 cents per copy. Of this, we paid "extra" for collating (2.7 cents) and for colored paper (2.2 cents). Various local club members and wives do the remaining grunt work—folding, stapling, and pasting on labels and stamps.

That adds up to about 40 cents per copy. We try for an average of one issue per month, so the annual cost per copy is around \$5. Half of your dues for the newsletter doesn't seem excessive. *But*, only half of the mailing list pays dues, so each one of you that does pay is carrying someone else. As a result, we are perpetually near the brink of calamity.

On a related subject, K1KI points out that in June **QST**, ARRL requests \$1.00 to cover postage and handling charges for a copy of the proposed FCC Plain Language rules. It appears that the League is beginning to face the fact that not all membership services can be provided at no cost to the recipient in today's economy. No doubt they will home in on services not accessed by the majority of members, such as awards, contest forms, etc.

Our centerfold this issue is the new club roster. With the flexibility available to us through DECset, we were able to compress each entry onto one line to improve readability, and still add space at the right margin for corrections and at the bottom of each page for additions. Antenna Tidbits

Unjamming Tailtwisters

Has your Tailtwister ever refused to turn the antenna? If so, you are in good company. Based on my experience with three different rotators, and that of others as well, I've concluded that sometimes the solenoid is unable to retract the brake wedge. Usually if I flip the motor switch one way or the other, the wedge breaks free. The factory confirms that the Tailtwister brake wedge is shaped differently for more strength and can "jam" when preloaded. Turning the motor relieves the preload.

This may not work if the rotator is at one of the limits, because the switches inside the rotator prevent turning further into the limit. *Don't climb the tower yet.* You can bypass the switches by jumpering terminals at the back of the control box - 5 to 8 for clockwise and 4 to 6 for counterclockwise.

Conductive Pastes

K1JX offers the following information for those of

us wondering whether or not to goop up the telescoping joints in our yagis, and if so, what to use. Several years ago, W3AU had an antenna which seemed not to work as well as it used to. Ed took it down and measured the resistance across a joint which had been treated with Penetrox. The resistance was very high, suggesting that the conductive stuff wasn't doing its job. After some research, he found that a more reliable substance is Dow Corning Molykote 41 grease. Clarke says he got a 5 oz. sample from a distributor by asking innocent questions, and has more than half left after applying it to all of K1VTM's antennas. ■

Is QST's Style Too Rudimentary?

Analysis of Reading Levels

Have you ever read through your favorite Amateur Radio journal and begun to wonder about the mentality of those who wrote the articles? Sometimes I've felt that what I'm reading is intended for the lowest common denominator—like the afternoon soap operas or evening prime time shows. I'm insulted by the plethora of two and three letter words in sentences maybe five or six words long. It's frustrating, having spent a fair amount of time and energy studying to pass tests on a subject as difficult as radio electronics, to be talked to like someone who flunked out

of kindergarden. The question is, am I too sensitive, or is the material really written for someone with a limited reading ability?

Two of the standard methods used for measuring the reading ease of English text are those of Rudolf Flesch (*The Art of Readable Writing*, Harper & Bros., 1949), and Edward Fry (*Journal of Reading*, April 1968). Both formulas are based on sentence lengths and syllable frequencies. The Flesch formula yields a number which is correlated with reading levels as follows:

Flesch Number	Reading Level
30.00 - 39.99	some college
40.00 - 49.99	high school grad
50.00 - 59.99	some high school
60.00 - 69.99	7th or 8th grade
70.00 - 79.99	6th grade

The results below, using the Flesch method, closely matched those obtained with the Fry formula, which I won't explain here.

June 1981 QST just happened to be on my desk when I decided to analyze some Amateur Radio reading material. No reason not to start with the biggest! Readability for some of the June articles came out as follows:

Some things are apparent right away. The overall reading level is relatively low, as I had suspected. The average Flesch number for technical articles is 53, corresponding to a reading level of someone with some high school education (about 10th grade). The article with the smallest Flesch number (highest reading level) is the one by G3PLX, reprinted from a foreign magazine. The minutes of the Board meeting are written at a level more difficult to read than all except two of the other articles! (Maybe we're not supposed to read them—does the microscopic print give you headaches too?) The Plain Language Rules are written at a level more difficult to read than the average technical article; evidently the FCC rates our reading ability somewhat higher than does the ARRL.

Perhaps it is a bit presumptuous to say that the material in QST is at a level well below the abilities of most readers, without some evidence characterizing the average subscriber's reading skills. It happens that the ARRL spent many thousands of your dollars last year to survey the Amateur Radio community (see March 1981 QST). One of the questions asked of the participants was the highest level of education which they had completed. The results were:

Grade school or less	2%
Some high school	9
High school graduate	19
Some college	32
College graduate	18
Some graduate work	8
Graduate degree	14

The center of the distribution is clearly a high school graduate with some college. This is indeed well above the level of education implicitly assumed by the average QST article.

Now you may argue that it is *content* that matters, not the manner in which the information is conveyed. True, but for complex subjects there must be a point where simple words and phrases become inadequate. I believe we are losing important detail due to this effect, unnecessarily.

I've sent copies of this analysis to all ARRL Directors. If you agree with me that the reading level of QST should be brought up to that of its audience, call or write your Director and express your opinion.

I plan to apply the Flesch formula to other Amateur Radio magazines, both domestic and foreign, and to some examples of literary excellence such as *War and Peace*, the *New York Times*, and *Penthouse*. If you have some appropriate text for this endeavor, send me a copy. ■

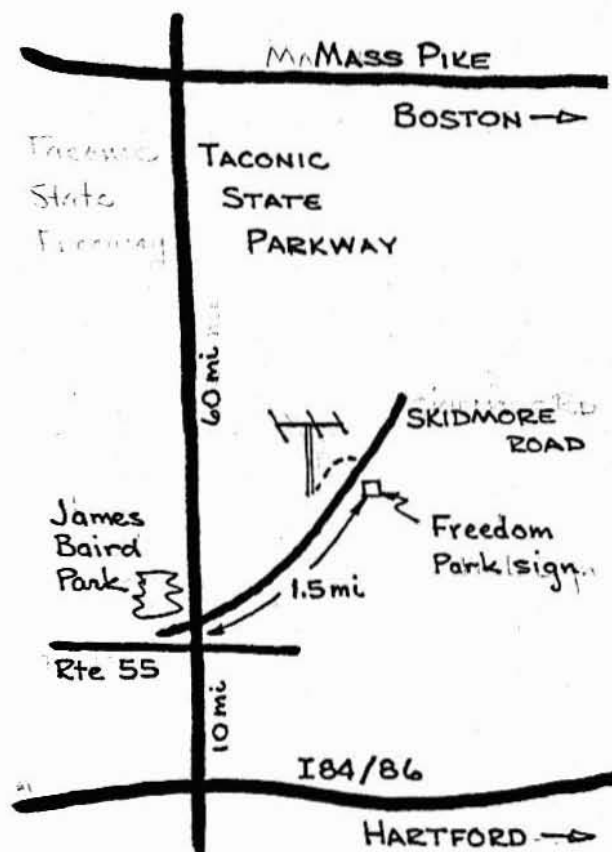

How to Find W2YV

From the Mass Pike, get on the Taconic State Parkway south for 60 miles. Skidmore Road is about 1 mile past James Briar Park.

From east of Sturbridge, MA, take Interstate 84/86 into NY and get on Taconic Parkway north at exit 16N. Skidmore Road is about 10.5 miles from Interstate 84, immediately past the second Route 55 exit.
