# Secretary's Report Yankee Clipper Contest Club

The February, 1989, YCCC meeting was held at the Sheraton Sturbridge in Sturbridge, Massachusetts, on February 5, 1989, and attracted 82 members and their guests. The business meeting was chaired by Fred, K2TR, Club President. Members took home stacks of log sheets, dupe sheets, and other forms for the upcoming ARRL DX Contests. The treasury balance stood at \$1432.65. Fred, K2TR, delivered an ARRL DX Contest pep talk, reminding us all to help beat FRC. Billy, KR1R, handed out plaques and awards from last year's ARRL contests:

Dave, KY1H, then spoke briefly on the packet network. Dave had packet cluster running, with all new commands, and urged everyone to try it out before the spring contests. You can get a list of the commands from him for a large SASE. He also brought along a TNC totally covered with foil and its cables covered with braid, and said he had finally managed to de-RFI his packet system. Dick, KB1H, also had some packet questions for Dave.

Ed, NT2X, had some club jackets with him, and indicated that he would like to get out of the jacket business and was looking for a volunteer to take it over (contact Ed if you can help). He mentioned that Rich, K2RW, of the Tri-State DX Cluster packet system (covering NY, CT, and NJ) would like to connect to other packet systems (we could disconnect them during contests). Ed also mentioned a proposal by the Central Radio Club of the USSR for a joint US/USSR contest in April, replacing the Gargarin Cup contest for this year (that contest is only held once every three years), with complex rules (see QST).

Carl, WG2E, had Digicom-64 program disks, schematics, and ordering information.

Following the business meeting and break, Bill, N1CQ, introduced the afternoon's technical program. Jeff, K1ZM, discussed and showed slides of the impressive 160m and 80m antennas at NP4A. John, KB1T, sold his Contest Calendars, donating part of the proceeds to the Club treasury. Julius Jones, W2IHY, presented the W2IHY Audio Keyer. This station accessory holds 54 seconds of audio in 4 memories, can accept either low or high impedance microphones (by changing resistors on the board), was published in the 1989 ARRL Handbook (see chapter 29), and is constructed of readily-available components. # THE CLUB RESOURCES PAGE THE Place to Find Club Information

DUES are due at the April election meeting, which begins our club "contest year", with a grace period until the end of June. Membership in the club will lapse at the end of the grace period if dues are not paid up. In order to re-join the club, a lapsed member must attend a meeting, like any new member, and be welcomed back into membership, or may become a subscriber to the Scuttlebutt by paying up (see below). Club members who move out of club territory and so are not eligible to contribute to club aggregate scores automatically become subscribers. New members who join at the last meeting of the club's contest year (February) are credited with dues for the following year (that is, the contest year beginning that April). You can tell if you owe dues by checking your Butt mailing label. Only paid-up members are eligible to contribute to the the club score in contests.

FAMILY MEMBERS Members of the same family living at the same address may elect to receive only one copy of the Butt. One member of the family must pay full dues, enabling the rest of the family to join as family members. Being a family member is currently free.

STUDENT MEMBERS Full-time students are eligible for dues at half the regular rate.

SCUTTLEBUTT SUBSCRIBERS Anyone may subscribe to the club newsletter, the Scuttlebutt. A subscription currently costs \$10 per year. At the present time, overseas subscriptions cost the same as domestic (we have very few overseas subscribers). The subscription period begins at the beginning of the club year, in April. New subscribers who begin their subscriptions after the December issue are considered to have paid for the following year (that is, they receive as many issues as new members joining at that time do). You can tell if your subscription is current by checking your Butt mailing label. The grace period for late subscriptions is the same as for late memberships.
